ROAD SAFETY

We would like to remind all our families to **drive** and park safely around our school. IMPORTANT REMINDERS:

- Please remember to pay your school fees.
 - Parents must provide an explanation for student absences, within 7 days, from the first day of any period of absence.
- Family holidays during the school term should be avoided, if possible. Days off for this purpose (an official exemption is needed) count as absences, are recorded on school reports and disrupt schooling.
- If students bring mobile phones to school, they must be handed in at the school office before school and collected at the end of the day. Student phones must remain off whilst on school grounds. Failure to do so will mean your parent will need to collect your phone from the office.
- Medication (apart from that stipulated in a Health Care Plan developed by parents, doctor and the school) is not to be administered by any school staff, without written permission by the parent.
